ANTIOCH IN SYRIA

BARNABAS BRINGS PAUL FROM TARSUS TO HELP WITH THE MINISTRY IN AN-TIOCH.

FIRST JOURNEY

CYPRUS PAUL, BARNABAS AND JOHN MARK SAILED TO CYPRUS AND THERE PROCLAIMED THE GOOD NEWS AND ESTABLISHED A CHURCH

ANTIOCH IN PISIDIA

Paul, Barnabas and John Mark travel to what is modern day turkey to preach and teach. There were minimal results.

LYSTRA PAUL AND

BARNABAS HEALED A CRIPPLE AND WERE PROCLAIMED AS GODS. PAUL RE-FUSED THE TITLE AND THIS LED TO THE PEOPLE STONING PAUL AND DRAGGING HIM OUT OF THE CITY.

SECOND JOURNEY

PHILIPPI PAUL PREACHES HERE AND BECAUSE OF HIS SUCCESS STAYS FOR QUITE A WHILE

THESSALO-NICA PAUL MAKES SOME CONVERTS BUT THERE IS MUCH

THERE IS MUCH OPPOSITION AND ONE BELIEVER IS JAILED.

ATHENS

PAUL USES THE ATHENIANS LOVE FOR DEBATE TO EN-GAGE THEM. HE HAS ONLY LIMITED SUCCESS.

CORINTH

PAUL TRAVELED FROM ATHENS TO CORINTH WHERE HE STAYED WITH AQUILA AND PRISCILLA. AT COR-INTH, PAUL MADE HIS LIVING BY MAK-ING TENTS.

THIRD JOURNEY

EPHESUS PAUL'S FRIENDS AQUILA AND PRISCILLA, WERE IN EPHESUS. BEFORE PAUL JOINED THEM IN EPHESUS THEY MET A JEWISH CHRISTIAN NAMED APOLLOS, WHOM THEY INSTRUCTED FURTHER IN THE FAITH

GREECE

PAUL PASSED THROUGH MACEDONIA THEN HE RETURNED TO GREECE, WHERE HE STAYED FOR THREE MONTHS, PROBABLY IN CORINTH. DUR-ING THIS TIME HE WROTE TO THE ROMANS.

ASIA MINOR

PAUL RETURNED FROM GREECE TO TROAS IN ASIA MI-NOR. THERE HE TALKED LATE INTO THE NIGHT. A BOY FALLS OUT OF WIN-DOW AND DIES, YET PAUL HEALS HIM.

JERUSALEM

PAUL MEETS WITH CHURCH LEADERS TO NEGOTIATE THE PLACE OF GENTILES IN THE CHURCH AND ALSO ENCOUN-TERS PROBLEMS AT THE JEWISH TEMPLE.



FINAL JOURNEY

CAESAREA

AFTER MORE THAN TWO YEARS OF IM-PRISONMENT AT CAESAREA, PAUL WAS SENT BY SHIP TO-WARD ROME.

VOYAGE

FROM CNIDUS IN ASIA MINOR, PAUL'S SHIP TURNED SOUTH, BATTLING THE WINDS. THEY SOUGHT SHELTER ON THE ISLAND OF CRETE. THE SHIP STOPPED BRIEFLY AT A PLACE CALLED FAIR HAVENS ON THE SOUTHERN COAST OF CRETE. SINCE THE HARBOR WAS NOT SUITABLE FOR WINTERING. THEY ATTEMPTED TO REACH A PORT CALLED PHOENIX, WHICH WAS FUR-THER WEST ON CRETE.

ROME

IN ROME, PAUL WAS KEPT UNDER HOUSE ARREST FOR TWO YEARS. HE WAS GUARDED BY A SOL-DIER AND HAD TO PROVIDE HIS OWN FINANCIAL SUPPORT. HE WAS ABLE TO RE-CEIVE VISITORS AND MET WITH MEMBERS OF THE LOCAL JEW-ISH COMMUNITY AND MANY OTHERS.
